1. Welcome/Opening Statement

2. SCC Training

Committee responsibilities

SCC members watched a 7 minute training via online about the responsibilities of SCC. The SCC members act as an advisory committee. Principal Gledhill addressed the roles and responsibilities of council members. She also addressed the Rules of Order and Procedure that the council will follow.

b. Digital citizenship

Principal Gledhill explained our districts internet filtering system. She talked about Peardeck Digital Citizenship. She also explained that YouTube is available for teachers and students to view with limited access.

3. Council Business/Introductions

4. Schedule for 2018-2019

Jamie Pintar presented a draft outline of the SCC meeting schedule for the year. Jill Marshall motioned to approve meeting schedule. Whitney Hancock seconded the motion with a unanimous vote from all members to approve schedule.

5. Current School Plan

SCC members were reviewed current year's school improvement plan (See copy of Trustlands plan). Principal Gledhill stated that technology is our biggest issue and where the most money is being spent. We have an additional \$10,000 to spend for the current school year. How should we spend the money? Principal Gledhill stated that chromebooks

have a life expectancy of 5 years and cost around \$200 to replace. Our upper grades are 1:1 in each class with chromebooks. The younger grades are about 2:1.

6. Options Unit Movie Approval- "Ralph Breaks the Internet" Rated PG

Nate Melton, Options Unit teacher, has asked for approval from SCC to send home a parent permission slip to take his class, along with Jamie Pinar's self-contained resource class, to *Ralph Breaks the Internet* movie at Provo Towne Center. The movie is rated PG and will require signed parent permission to attend.

Whitney Hancock motioned to approve sending the permission slip home. Bryce Moore seconded the motion. 6 members approved sending note home and one member abstained from voting. Permission slip will be sent home to parents in Mr. Melton's class and Mrs. Pinar's morning class.

7. Questions, Comments or Concerns

a. **Vision Screening Question:** A few parents have expressed concern about how parents are being notified if their child did not pass vision screening at school. Principal Gledhill addressed this concern stating that the school nurse notifies each parent if a child failed the vision screening and may need to see a physician for follow-up.

Annalyse Anderson, 6th grade teacher, shared a story about her class. Many of her sixth graders admitted to talking to people online that they didn't know. She later did a lesson on the importance of not talking or gaming with people that are unknown. She told them that people lie about who they are when online.

Julie Hamilton shared a story of a family member learning about what is real and what is not online. Just because it's online, doesn't mean it is true.

Principal Gledhill told the council that digital citizenship is being taught in the students keyboard special class. She will send home a note to parents telling them about our digital citizenship.

Students are asked to always ask their parents or teachers if they ever in doubt.

5. School Assessment Data

Principal Gledhill shared what materials are being used for assessments. She shared what Professional Development has been completed and what is planned for the future for the teachers at East Meadows. She also shared the success of the LLI reading program that is being implemented for 2nd-3rd grade students as an intervention. Special ed students are also being taught through LLI. There are five intervention technicians that have been hired to take the class over while regular education teacher runs the intervention groups.
